Lions 105M Centennial

I hope that many of you will be aware already that Lions Clubs International will be 100 years old in 2017.

Celebration of this will run from the start of the 2016-2017 Lions year up until the end of the calendar year 2017. The logo above can be adopted as soon as you like – it can be found on the Lions100.org website, along with other resources and information – as well as the Centennial slogan, “Where there’s a need there’s a Lion”.

The aim is to capitalise on a virtuous circle – Service is Celebrated; Celebration gets Publicity; Publicity gets Members; Members gets Service achieved; Service is Celebrated; and on and on. International President Joe Preston has already launched the Centennial Service Challenge; and the Centennial Membership Challenge (which finally pushed membership through the 1.4million mark), although it is important that we do not run out of steam before 2016-17, but because we want to arrive at the start of that year with good news worth shouting about already.

Within our own District, Kettering Lions Club & Kidderminster & District Lions Club have already received awards for their achievements against the Centennial Service Challenge, which I’m really pleased about.

Some plans are also taking shape at Multiple District level (Lion Ron Cross and I are attending the MD Centennial Co-Ordination meetings), covering many possible Service activities.

These range from Recycling 1,000,000 batteries, to making 100,000 Blood Donations; arranging 100,000 Diabetes screenings to planting 100,000 bulbs; 1,000,000 spectacles recycled to 100,000 lengths of a 50m pool being swum for charity; and the list goes on. The intention is that Centennial branded polo shirts will be used along the theme “I gave blood... with my friends/I planted trees... with my friends” etc, so that there will hopefully be a growing, but consistent, visibility to our Service.

We will share news of these MD Challenges as the arrangements become more settled. You can make a start now with the Battery recycling; don't accumulate lots of batteries (that poses a fire risk!), but start logging the total weight (rather than the number) of any domestic batteries you recycle at home or at work, which will then be converted in due course to the equivalent number of AA batteries recycled. Please let Lion Ron Cross know how you are getting along with that.

Of course, proper recording of all these activities on MyLCI is very important – it is by adding together the achievements across the District, the Multiple District and Internationally that the facts and figures make the biggest impression.

We will only get one shot at our Centenary – we'd better try to get it right!



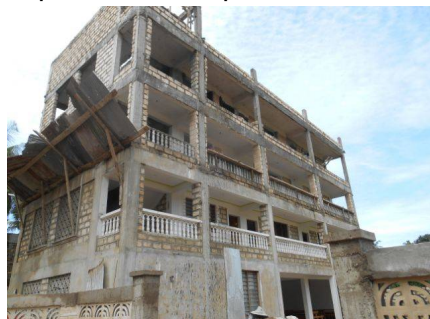
North Sea Lions

Message from the Competitions officer, Ken Barker

Why are the various competitions organised by Lions Clubs International so poorly supported?

Is it because Clubs do not think competitions are something a community service organisation should not be involved in or is it simply apathy ?

Either way not supporting our competitions is a missed opportunity to showcase, acknowledge and reward the talented youngsters in your area.

There must be talented artists in your area so seek them out and support them in the Lions Peace Poster competition.



This annual contest encourages young people who are aged 11, 12 or 13 on or before November 15th to think about what peace means to them and to share their own unique vision with others through art. The contest theme changes annually with the 2015-16 theme being "Share Peace." Young people select a medium as outlined in the Contest Rules and Conditions to draw, paint or sketch their interpretation of the theme. Each poster is then judged on originality, artistic merit and expression of the theme. Clubs wishing to sponsor an entry into this contest should approach local schools and youth organisations to request their participation and purchase a Peace Poster pack from MDHQ by October 1st. The cost of

a pack for the 2015-16 contest is £11.00 plus package and postage. The pack includes an Achievement Award Certificate and a Certificate of Appreciation together with details of all the rules and information needed to enter the competition. Any questions regarding the contest should be directed to the District Competitions Officer.

Please note: It is really important that the rules of the competition are adhered to. In particular:

1. Artwork must be no smaller than 13 inches by 20 inches and no larger than 20 inches by 24 inches. Do not mat or frame artwork.
2. Three dimensional entries will not be accepted. Nothing may be glued, stapled or attached to the artwork in any way.
3. The use of lettering or numbering on the front of the poster is not allowed.
4. Artwork should be produced on a flexible material so that it can be rolled for posting in a postage tube. Do not fold the poster.
5. A kit must be purchased for each entry sponsored.
6. Entries should be received by the Competitions Officer by no later than November 15th to allow judging to take place at the November Cabinet Meeting (to be held on November 22nd in 2015).
7. Participants accept all responsibility for late, lost, misdirected or illegible entries.
8. Entries cannot be returned or acknowledged. They become the property of Lions Clubs International upon receipt.

Peace Poster leaflets are available from MDHQ at a cost of 90p for 10.

Wellesbourne and Shakespeare Lions clubs' raft race 26 July

Sheldon Lions have won the Lions Club Cup as the fastest Lions raft on the River Avon for more than a decade. More than 60 rafts enter this event each year but Sheldon have been the only Lions Club to do so. **So in 2015 why not join them and give them some competition.**

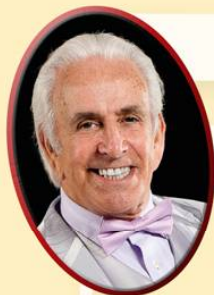
