#### Knowle and Dorridge Lions Bike Ride Success



Almost 700 cyclists saddled up and rode up to 31 miles on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> July from Packwood House, Lapworth. This was the Club's 10<sup>th</sup> bike annual ride, the fourth Heart of England bike ride in aid of the British Heart Foundation and local causes. Funds are still coming in but the Club hope to exceed last year's £18,000 raised, and will easily pass the target of £100,000 raised for charity over the 10 years of this event.

Donna Stokes, local BHF Fundraising Manager said: "We are absolutely delighted with the number of participants. This successful bike ride attracted over

600 participants last year and even more people joined us this year. Feedback was overwhelmingly positive, people really enjoyed the event, advising us how well organised it was and many people enter year after year. I would also like to thank the Knowle and Dorridge Lions for all their hard work and everyone who supported this event."

"We are very fortunate to have two National Trust properties on our patch and have developed a strong relationship with their managers over more than two decades" said Lion President Bob Thurtle. "Both properties are very accommodating opening up extra parking for our Lions Festive Walk from Baddesley Clinton House after Christmas and the Heart of England Bike Ride in July from Packwood House. Walkers and riders also enjoy free entrance to the houses and gardens after their exercise."

#### Rugby Rokeby Lions sponsors new trophy in memory of Lion Geoff Thompson

When Rugby Rokeby Lions heard that a new trophy was needed for the District 'Young Ambassador of the Year' competition, they decided that this was an ideal opportunity to create a legacy to the memory of Lion Geoff Thompson, who was a stalwart to District Lionism over many years.



After many years of dedicated service to the District and Rugby Rokeby, Geoff died in December 2011 and at his funeral, a retiring collection was taken, the proceeds of which were over £1000. These were very generously donated to Rugby Rokeby Lions in Geoff's memory, by his widow Jean, with a specific request that they be used for Youth projects as they were one of Lion Geoff's passion. In line with this request, the Club set up the Lion Geoff Thompson Memorial Fund which to date has funded various

Youth related activities including providing a £100 bursary for the winner of the 'Rugby Young Sports Volunteer of the Year'.

It therefore seemed fitting that Lion Geoff's memory should live on through the auspices of a new trophy for the winner of the District 105M "Young Ambassador of the Year" competition, together with replica keepsake miniatures for the winners. We're sure Geoff would have liked that.

## Balsall Common Lions Club funds next generation of life savers.

Leading first aid charity, St John Ambulance, delivered training to over 100 pupils, in Year Five from Berkswell Church of England School, Year Six at Balsall Common Primary School and Lady Katherine Leveson Church of England School in Temple Balsall.

The youngsters learnt essential first aid skills, including guidance on choking, helping an unconscious casualty and administering cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) to restart someone's heart.

Lion Ann Pemberton, Youth Officer, said: "This

was the fourth year that we have made a donation to these local schools for first aid training. We are delighted to have worked with St John Ambulance once again to help equip these youngsters with such important skills."

Nick Pitt, Regional Schools Training Co-ordinator for St John Ambulance in the West Midlands, said: "These pupils are now the next generation of first aiders in the local community. We believe that anyone should receive first aid training, regardless of age. This was a generous donation from the Lions Club and one that could mean the difference between a life saved and a life lost."

Recent research by St John Ambulance found that nearly 58% of children in the West Midlands region have no life saving knowledge at all, leaving them without the skills to deal with basic emergency situations such as identifying if someone is breathing or how to help someone who is choking.




