First Aid Training at Heart Of England School, Balsall Common (Picture)



Sixth Formers and Year 10 and 11 students have been skilling up in the essentials of first aid at special training sessions offered as part of the Health and Social Care extended curriculum. The training is to equip students for their work placements this year and will be useful for post-16 students applying for health and sports related courses

"It's a really useful course and gives the opportunity for students to gain valuable training as they move on into their future careers." said Sam Grierson, teacher of Health and Social Care. "These are

important live-saving skills to have and will be of immediate value to our school community, within families and within the work place."

The bespoke sessions which were engaging, informative and practical with students practicing techniques like resuscitation and the recovery position and learning how to deal with asthma, choking and shock emergencies. There was plenty of equipment to go round as students took on bandaging and practicing resuscitation of both adults and babies.

Year 10 students received a two hour introduction to a resuscitation training programme which included communication and casualty care and casualty primary survey as well as recovery and resuscitation. The training was delivered by St John Ambulance as part of their Every Child a Lifesaver drive. Miss Grierson said, "Trainer Richard Whittingham was wonderful, demonstrating key issues and soon got our students engaging in practical activities."

The course was made possible through funding received from Balsall Common Lions Club and we offer our gratitude not only as Heart of England School, but also on behalf of the wider community who will undoubtedly be the ultimate beneficiaries of this opportunity.

"Everyone could practice skills within the session and students were really engaged in the experience. It was a very worthwhile event," concluded Miss Grierson.

After many months of searching for a young person within our home communities to represent 105M as Young Ambassador of the 21st Century the search for this year is over.

The District Final was held on Sunday 22nd November 2015 at St John's Hotel Solihull. Three Lions Clubs had found a quality trio of young people to be candidates, all were impressive, all working hard within their schools and in their communities. Charles James-Pemberton sponsored by Shakespeare Lions Club, who have a good liaison with local youth and schools in their area and cultivate this to participate in Young Leaders in Service and Young Ambassador year on year. Lions Club, again the Club has very well established links with local schools and works with them on all kinds of youth projects. The third candidate was Jessica Browne sponsored by Shirley Lions Club, who have a good track record when choosing the winning candidate, again with strong links in the youth voluntary sectors in and around Shirley.

The competition took place throughout the morning, each candidate presenting a three minute outline of their project and how they would spend the bursary of £500 should they win, followed by 20 minutes of questioning by three judges. The education and lead judge Chris Parry, the business judge Chris Train and the voluntary sector judge Jackie Lees, all commented on how impressed they were with each candidate and how difficult it had been to decide upon a winner, as all the projects were impressive.



The judges spent a long time deliberating, some of the time over a lovely lunch, but eventually a winner was decided upon. Jessica Browne sponsored by Shirley Lions Club was declared the winner in front of many Cabinet Officers that had stopped to support this competition. She was awarded a Winner's Certificate by Chris Parry and DG Heather, and at District Convention in March 2016 she will receive the Lion Geoff Thompson Memorial Trophy to keep for twelve months plus a smaller replica to keep.

Jessica has been involved in developing, planning, designing, planting and maintenance of a Sensory Garden on Castle Bromwich Green to enable the disabled and able bodies to access it, in the garden is a Peace Tree in remembrance of all those who have lost their lives in conflicts around the world. She is a member of the local Youth Parish Council and takes her duties very seriously. As well as her school work she is also an impressive

gymnast on the trampoline, there appears to be no end to her talents.

Jessica will now represent 105M in the MD Finals to be held the weekend of 19th – 21st February 2016, at The Village Hotel, Dudley, West Midlands, all Lions are invited, especially to attend the award ceremony on the morning of Sunday 21st February 2016, there is no cost, and as it's on 105M's patch easily accessible. She will also be at District Convention a month later to receive her award.

I would ask all clubs in 105M to rise to the challenge of finding a Young Ambassador Candidate for next year NOW. Young people have so much enthusiasm, energy and foresight they can enhance any Lions Club and they are our future.

Knitted poppies point to Citizen of Year accolade

A WOMAN whose love of knitting created a sensation has been named Wolverhampton's Citizen of The Year. Linda Evans turned her hand to making woollen

Linda Evans turned her hand to making woollen poppies six years ago and has since raised more than £14,000 for the Royal British Legion. Nominations from readers of the Chronicle's sister pub-lication the Express & Star readers were whittled down to a shortlist from which the winner was selected by the Lions Club, which has been running the annual award since 1977. President Trevor Jones said: "The aim is to give a public thank you to those

since 1977. President Trevor Jones said: "The aim is to give a public thank you to those who work tirelessly for the local community without seeking recognition. The deciding factor for Linda was the amount of work and effort that goes into making the poppies."

Stem

It all started by chance after the head fell off the Remembrance Day poppy of her aunt, said Mrs Evans, a 63-year-old mother-of-three from Owen Road, Bilston. "She arrived at my house with just the leaf and stem,"

"I had just knitted some flowers for a coffee morn-ing and one of them was a

poppy. "I attached it to what was left of hers and she wore it to church the following amisation of and her name the Lions Ch award shield.

Mrs Evans buys the pins and fabric for the leaves but is helped with donations of red wool. She raised f48 in two weeks that year and has seen demand soar ever since.

Last year she produced 5,300 poppies which were all snapped up by people from as far afield as Australia and America.

She also find time to help raise funds for the organ at Coven Methodist Church, hold flower arranging demonstrations, and help a local day care centre.

She received a personal-ised plaque together with £150 for the charity or or-ganisation of her choice and her name was added to the Lions Club community
