Corby Lions Help Local Foodbank

Louise explained, 'Since we began giving out food in 2012 we have distributed over 5500 food parcels to families and individuals from the Corby area. The amount of food we have given to people in need comes to over 9 tonnes! We rely entirely on donations from the local community and continue to be well supported by churches, schools and community groups.

People who use foodbank are people who are experiencing financial crisis ranging from problems with benefits to debt issues to working people on low income struggling to make ends meet. We are a short term solution and hope to be able to fill a gap rather than become something people become dependant upon. We hope to see a decrease in the use of the foodbank in the coming years but at the moment we continue to give out around 25 parcels a week. We couldn't do this without an army of volunteers who regularly give up their time every week.

We will be having a big collection at the Corby Tesco Extra from Thursday 1st December - Sunday 4th December. We hope that Corby will support us with the generosity it always has.'

programme is a factory floor at each of the 3 centres, where members get vocational experience assembling, packing, sticking, stuffing and labelling. Through our education classes we also teach our members independent living skills, cookery and working with computers. The members also enjoy a wide range of activities which include football, tennis, archery, pottery, singing and walking.



Challenge to raise awareness

The mayor of Walsall donned a blindfold and tried to navigate her way around part of the borough to raise awareness for those who have lost their sight.

Councillor Kath Phillips was joined by her husband and consort Maurice as they walked round Aldridge shopping centre.

They were also joined by members of the Aldridge and District Lions Club as part of the Lions World Sight Day.

They were supported by the club's president Diane Price and membership chairman Mike Barker.

Mr Barker, 75, explained: "We have done lots in the past to support World sight Day but despite other Lions clubs across the country doing this we had not, so we invited the mayor and her consort to try it out and were delighted when they accepted. ping centre without the blindfold and then we put the mask on.

"I got to take them both for a coffee afterwards and the mayor spoke about how she found it a 'sober experience' and compared it to being in a dark cave.

"She also said it had never occurred to her how her and her husband would get on if they both lost their site.

"Her consort said he had concentrated really hard during the walk without the mask but then as soon as it was pulled down he completely lost his concentration. I was absolutely chuffed to get them to come out and support us and was really grateful that they stayed for a coffee afterwards." The Lions, which is an international organisation and has clubs all over the world, dedicated itself to helping the blind after blind and deaf member Helen Keller gave a speech in April 1925 calling on members to be 'knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness'.

World Sight Day is an annual day of awareness held on the second Thursday of October, to focus global attention on blindness and vision impairment.

It was a really good meal and served very professionally.

During the evening, we hosted the 2nd Short Heath Scout Group, who were a really nice group of Beavers, boys and girls and, of course their leaders, who I truly admire for the voluntary hours they give to our young people.

They had a good time as did we and we played a game before they left.

Thursday was another experience altogether.

I am glad to say they reached their target.


