Christmas came early for Jake and Mason, two Shirley youngsters, who both suffer from a severe neurological disorder called Dravet Syndrome. The condition is life limiting and causes prolonged recurrent epileptic seizures with a wide spectrum of related problems such as learning difficulties and ataxia.

Shirley Lions first became aware of the boys when local pub Woodman's Rest launched an appeal earlier this year to send them on a special holiday with their mother Meggie. The Lions contributed to the fund but when a

health issue meant that the arrangements had to be curtailed to a UK holiday some money was left over so the Lions discussed with Meggie how best to spend the balance.

It was decided that an iPad would help both boys with entertainment and with learning. They already use various apps designed to help improve co-ordination and speech on their mother's smartphone but this is not always practical, particularly on their frequent visits to hospital.

The Lions were also fortunate to have a similar used Android device donated by a member of the club, which was also passed on to the boys.

Mother Meggie said "Jake and Mason are so excited, they can't wait to get started. It will be wonderful for

keeping them entertained in the car too. I'm so grateful to Shirley Lions for their generosity"

Perfect Walking with Knowle & Dorridge

A cold sunny day led to near perfect walking conditions when Lions from Balsall Common, Birmingham Sheldon, Shirley, Kingswinford-Stourbridge and Warwick joined almost 2500 other Festive Walkers for Knowle & Dorridge Lions Festive Walk from Baddesley Clinton NT House on 27 December.

'We had to apologise to those walkers unable to park at the property who had to walk to the start of the



walks', said organiser Lion Ute Smith. 'We were really disappointed when we were unable to use the overflow car park at Baddesley, due to muddy conditions, which meant more car loads of walkers than ever were turned away. Many of these then found alternative parking and walked to the start.' The parking difficulties certainly did not affect walkers generosity with approaching £11,000 being donated for Prostate Cancer UK. Motor Neurone Disease Association. Birmingham St Mary's Hospice as well as local causes As has become a tradition about a dozen runners started off for the 9 mile route at 8:30

as the Lions had brought the walks start time forward to 9:00 in the hope of encouraging walkers to burn off the Christmas pud earlier. This together with the ideal walking conditions encouraged more walkers to take on the longer 9 and 6 mile walks, the 3 miles being more popular with the late starters.

'We have a great relationship with the National Trust at Baddesley Clinton and they helped us throughout the day but they do have strict rules like not allowing us to park cars on the drive or in fields off the drive.

We searched hard with them for a solution this year but local landowners were unable to help and we were unable to source such a great venue with more parking,' said Ute. 'Next year will be the 25th consecutive year for our walks at Baddesley Clinton and it will be a shame if we cannot accommodate everyone wishing to take part.'
