These are based at Exeter- a learning Community, Kingswood Community Centre, Pengreen Centre and Woodnewton - a learning Community. Julia Kitson and Donna Gallagher accepted the money watched by Lions Dan McDonald, Mike Garlick and Ronnie Vickers. A Lions spokesman commented, 'We have been collecting at Christmas in the local supermarkets and giving the proceeds to the centres for the last four years. All of this has been

Julie Kitson explained, 'The money will be used as part of the support offered to families in difficult circumstances. We work with families dealing with mental health problems, difficulties with parenting or with their own relationships, domestic abuse, children with behavioural difficulties, problems in engaging with education as well emotional or physical welfare issues. Our work is based on the principal of empowerment, working with families, supporting them into universal services until they are able to manage without support. Our aim is to strengthen families and communities by building skills and resilience, preventing family breakdown and improving outcomes for children, their parents and other members of the family.'




