Warwick Lions

Kingswinford and Stourbridge Lions help to make our Big Push wheelchair campaign a roaring success



THE News Group's Big Push Campaign is proving a roaring success - just weeks after it was launched.

Fundraising group The Kingswinford and Stourbridge Lions have become the latest community organisation to buy a brand new wheelchair for Russells Hall Hospital in Dudley as part of our drive to raise £30,000 to fund 50 new state-of-the-art chairs for use by patients and frail visitors.

And thanks to the generous donation of £600 - the campaign, which we are running in partnership with the Dudley Group NHS Charity, has now topped £8,000.

Karen Rice, spokesman for the Kingswinford and Stourbridge Lions Club, said: "When we read about the wheelchair campaign we felt it was something we could help out with as we always try to support local charities and people." The donation from the Lions comes thick and fast after Dudley Zoo bosses took along mascot Jambi the tiger to test out the chair they have recently sponsored.

Karen Phillips, fundraising manager for the Dudley Group NHS Charity, said she's delighted at how the community has embraced the campaign and it's not the first time the Lions have generously supported the hospital.

Last year the dedicated members donated an Accuvein machine to Russells Hall after a year-long fundraising campaign to buy the state-of-the-art machine.

Karen said: "It was good to meet up again with Kate Parkes and Mike Blaxland from the Kingswinford and Stourbridge Lions. They are regular supporters of the hospital charity and we are so grateful to them for sponsoring a wheelchair.

Worcester Lions Club Blind Driving Lions Clubs International World Sight Day this year is Thursday 12th October. Worcester Lions Club have not been able organise anything to promote this in the city on that date, but are organizing a "Blind Driving" day at the Worcestershire Cricket Ground on **Saturday 28th**



October, between 11-00 am and 3-00 pm.

The car is a dual controlled Mini from **RED Driving School**, with an experienced driving instructor. The first drive around an oval course is done sighted under instructions. The second and third are done blindfolded again under FULL instruction. Each drive lasts about 5-10 minutes.

Those taking part will experience that a blind or parochially sighted person would,

when

attempting to drive and draw attention to the importance of maintain good sight.

To take part you must be over 18 years of age, hold a full UK driving licence, and show the ability to read a number plate at a distance of 20 plus metres away.

Although there will be no charge for taking part in the experience. Any donations made will go to the driving instructors chosen charity. Which is "Little Hearts Mater, (LHM)" and Worcester Lions Club.




