Tommy comes to Bedworth

Thursday 13th September saw the ceremonial presentation of the "Tommy" statue to the Mayor and Mayoress of Nuneaton & Bedworth, Councillor Chris Watkins and Collette Watkins. The statue was donated by Bedworth Lions on behalf of the people of Bedworth. The presentation took place at the new Armistice Gates and wall at the entrance to the Miners Welfare Park. The Mayor said that this was yet another fine example of how the people of Bedworth come together.

The full-sized Tommy statue, entitled "There but not There", commemorates the fallen of WW1 and pays acknowledgement to the fact that the town has continually observed Armistice Day annually since 1921.

Representatives from both the Armistice Parade Committee and the Royal British Legion took part in the short ceremony, and both will be working with Bedworth Lions on promoting the "Touring Tommy" project.

The Tommy will not yet be given a permanent home but will be taken around schools, places of worship and community centres in Bedworth, Bulkington, Exhall and surrounding villages. The statue will be available for up to a month at each venue, during which time the Lions hope it will be used as a tool to raise awareness about the sacrifices made by local people during the Great War. The first venue to receive it will be the Council House in Nuneaton. "Tommy" will form part of the Remembrance Sunday march in Bedworth.

Denise Musson, Project Lead for Bedworth Lions told us, "We will be holding drawing, poetry writing and story writing competitions at each venue, based on the Tommy and his possible life before and during the war. Bedworth Lions will donate small prizes. However, it is planned that we will in the future, produce a book called "The Bedworth Tommies", using all the best competition entries. Proceeds from sales of the book will be given to the Armistice Parade Committee and other local charities working with the armed forces".

105M Lead the Way



Extraordinary Convention 105CW

A wonderful day of fun and fellowship was experienced form those 160 Lions members that attended The EXTRAORDINARY CONVENTION MEETING 23.09.18 at THE CHASE HOTEL, ROSS ON WYE.

District Governor Sally Marsh 105W opened the meeting and welcomed everyone. The Convention was chaired by PDG Abhnash Bains 105A.

Members from Clubs in 105M and 105W and one Zone in 105E all convened to structure the way that our new District 105CW would be governed. There were 81 delegates representing 50 Clubs. July 2019 District CW will be born. The new District will be approximately 250 miles across and will have an approximate membership of 1700. In order to administer the new District the convention voted on the adoption of the Constitution, the budget and will elect the DG Team to govern the new District.

Resolution 1 that in order to set up a new District delegates were voting to adopt the **Standard District Constitution - This was** carried.

Election of District Governor 105 CW 2019-

Lion Ian Gott of Chipping Sodbury MD105W was the only candidate for DG 105CW and was duly elected.

Lion Richard Williams of Kidderminster & District Lions Club 105M was elected as 1st Vice District Governor for 2019.

Lion Jaap de Jonge of Shirley Lions Club was voted in as 2nd Vice District Governor.

Lion Christine Moss District Treasurer for 105M. proposed the new District Dues. The Dues Resolution was seconded by DG Sally Marsh 105W.

Resolution 2 The Dues Resolution:

"That the District Dues for District 105CW for 2019/20 be set at £9.00 per member, to be collected in 2 equal instalments of £4.50 on 1st July 2019 and on 1st January 2020, as calculated on the basis of the attached Draft Budget."

The Resolution was passed by a majority.

On the day there were some very informative presentations on LCIF by PCC Lion Andy Pemberton and also Twinning projects by Lion Keith Wilding and North Sea Lions by PDG Lion Alan Hall. There was also a great opportunity to ask guestions of the new DG team in the Q and A session. Chairman Abhnash bought Convention to a close and thanked everybody for organising an excellent convention. Chairman Abhnash handed over to Steward Sherman-Kahn DG 105M to make the closing remarks.

We all look forward to working together as 105CW.
