Kettering Lions present YLIS awards

3,900 hours of community service have been given by local young people in the past year through the Lions Clubs International 'Young Leaders in Service Award Scheme'.

Kettering & District Lions Club President, Barbara Gray, said, "They certainly dispel the myth that all young people are trouble-makers and we are extremely proud of their achievements, particularly helping those less fortunate than themselves".

The Club welcomed 49 exceptional young people and their families to the first presentation ceremony at Southfield School, which is a keen supporter of the scheme. On Tuesday 25th March 20 participants received Silver Standard Awards for 50 hours of service, and 29 received Gold Standard Awards for 100 hours. The internationally recognised 'Young Leaders in Service Award Scheme' rewards these community-minded young people, between the ages of 11 and 18, with badges and certificates signed by the Lions International President.

Other young people currently involved in the scheme include members of South & East Midlands Air Training Corps, Kettering Police Cadets, local youth clubs and other individuals.

The members are able to make new friends and the staff try to teach them a sense of independence and gain new personal skills. At the end of last year they moved to new premises at the rear of the fire station in Solihull and have had to renovate and totally decorate and furnish the new premises; a major part was given by Solihull Lions.

Ken Bate, the President of Solihull Lions said, "It is an honour to be able to give to such a worthy cause. The fact that SoLO has just moved to new premises in Solihull makes it all the more special. It is quite moving to hear what SoLO undertakes for its members and they seem to have so much fun as well as learning new things."

Lions Clubs partnership with the English Federation of Disability Sport (EFDS) began more than 20 years ago, and has so far raised over £200,000 to support their Regional and National Junior Athletics Championships.

This initiative has helped identify and develop new talent, as well as engaging many Lions members as volunteers. Every Lion member attending the National Junior Athletics Championship recalls this as a truly memorable experience. It is no wonder this event is an important part of our annual calendar, not only for fund-raising but for the pure fun gained in volunteering with this excellent organisation.

The English Federation of Disability Sport has a vision that disabled people are active for life. It was established in 1998 as the national body and charity dedicated to disabled people in sport and physical activity throughout England. The organisation works with a range of partners and sports to encourage participation at every level by disabled people and help sport to deliver inclusive programmes.

This partnership confirms two of Lions Clubs key areas of commitment to local communities: health and youth, encouraging fulfilling lives and empowering the next generation.

A Junior Athlete said "For me competing in athletics is an important part of my life, it not only gives me physical freedom but a mental freedom too. Athletics is one of my 'answers' to the situation I face day to day, whenever I train or compete it gives me a special feeling that comes from my heart and runs right through my body. A feeling of freedom, belonging and fitting into, what for me is and has been a crazy and testing life. On Saturday when I received my 2 Gold medals it brought everything into place, like icing on a cake. I can look at them, remember why I have them and know that I earned those medals and that I earned those few minutes of an indescribable powerful feeling. I aim to put my all into athletics so that I can feel the way it makes me feel."

Christopher in his new chair

Christopher is a pupil at Reynalds Cross Special School in Solihull and needed a new chair as his existing one was inadequate for his needs. Christopher lives in Solihull but has family connections in Balsall Common. Balsall Common Lions together with Solihull Lions were happy to make a contribution towards this. His school were then able to provide the difference.

Christopher's new chair was made to measure, fits him snugly, thereby making him feel safe and secure. Because the chair comes into contact with various pressure points on Christopher's body, it also provides him with a sensory experience whilst sitting in it. Christopher no longer rocks in his chair, but sits still and is much more contented.

In turn, his concentration has improved, enabling him to participate more in classroom activities.
